From this family that part of the town called Pixley Street derived its name. In Great Barrington, Joseph was allotted three of the forty proprietary rights, amounting to 1,200 acres.

7. **Ebenezer** (*William*¹), born May 13 (3?), 1678, at Westfield, Mass.; died December 19, 1716, at Westfield; married April 18, 1711, Mary, daughter of Jedidiah, son of Elder John Strong, of Northampton, Mass. She was born in 1683, and in 1717 married (2d) Benjamin Sexton, of Westfield.

24. *Elijah*, born March 15, 1714; died in 1716.

12. **Noah** (*Thomas*³) born August 13, 1706; died May 9, 1748; married ———, Abigail. Noah Pixley settled in Southampton, Mass., about 1737, and was killed by a band of Indians, who made a raid on that town in 1748. He had driven his cows to pasture and, while returning, was surprised, shot at, chased, tomahawked and scalped.
