Hubbell Buell Alvord united with the Center Church of Hartford, Conn., in 1838. After teaching school several years in Hartford, where he served as vice principal, he engaged in mercantile business in Bolton, Hartford and Wolcottville, Conn. Mr. Alvord, with his brother, Charles, was one of the organizers of the Excelsior Needle Co., of Torrington. Leaving this place in 1865, he went to Vineland, N. J., where he lived on a small fruit farm. He served on the school board and was also for many years a deacon in the Presbyterian Church at Vineland.
