

## CHAPTER III.

### *Pedigree of the Webber Family.*

The Pedigree of the Webber Family, Who Came to America

A. D. 1640.

Wolfert Webber, son of Wolfert of the Hague, Holland, who was married October 12, 1600, and this Wolfert Webber was married to the Lady Angeline Salynes, daughter of Madam Salynes, against her mother's will or consent, October 12, 1600, and the mother, Madam Salynes, was so indignant at the marriage that she made her will in 1640 and directed her trustees to sell all real estate and deposit cash in Orphans' Court at four per cent. interest; and it should remain until the sixth generation and the interest should lap over on the principal. This Orphans' Court is under the control of the Government, and this deposit under Madam Salynes' will in 1665 is the Webber Legacy. They employed lawyers for the last hundred years in trying to get it out of the hands of the Government. In 1806 the celebrated Aaron Burr was given \$5,000 and sent to Holland, but he got nothing and returned. Others have since been to Holland. This Wolfert Webber and Angeline Salynes had issue four children, and the third child was a son called Wolfert Webber, born May 12, 1604, and this Wolfert Webber married the Lady Annetta Wallace, daughter of Barron Jacob Wallace of the city of Harlem, Holland,
