The worthy Neisgen Selyns, widow of deceased Hendrick Coch, gatekeeper of this city, my very good acquaintance, moving, standing, in bodily health and in full possession of her understanding, speech and memory, as appeared from the powerful and absolute use she made thereof: who considering the frailty and weakness of human nature, the certainty of death and the uncertain time thereof and desirous by a testamentary disposition to prevent inconveniences hath heretofore in the best and authentic form and pursuant to law; as she can and may absolutely do so after mature deliberation and of her free and uncontrolled will, without being led or misled, induced or persuaded thereto (as she declares) made and doth make and ordain her testament, last and ultimate will in order to dispose of her temporal goods in manner following:

In Primas:

She commits her soul to the inconceivable grace of Almighty God and her perishable body to a Christian-like temporal.

And in the first instance the aforesaid testatrix hereby annuls and makes void and of none effect in a special manner the testamentary disposition some time since made and passed before me, notary, and certain Witnesses, to wit:

On the first day of February, 1606, together with all codicils and dispositions by her before the date here made or acknowledge in such manner that they shall have no power or effect whatsoever, and this of a new and this only shall dispose of her
