

he left £200 to the poor of Denbigh. He died in 1616, leaving issue—

- a. *Thomas Middleton*, under age in 1612.
- b. *Robert Middleton*, admitted to Gray's Inn 24 Oct., 1620. Living in 1626.
- c. *Richard Middleton*, living in 1623, being then about twenty years of age.

8. *Foulke Middleton*, of Plas Newydd, in Llansilan, Burgess of Denbigh, 1597, and Sheriff of Denbighshire in 1619. He died in 1630, having married Gwenhwyfar, daughter and heiress of Richard Wynn of Bodlith in Llansilan, by whom left issue—

- a. *Richard Middleton*, of Plas Newydd, Sheriff of Denbighshire in 1650. He is said to have "suffered much in the service of his Sovereign." Married Anne, daughter and co-heir of Andrew Meredith of Glantane, and left issue.
- b. *Hester*, married John Middleton, her cousin-german.
- c. *Elizabeth*, married Henry Llwyd, of Bers, co. Denbigh.

The line of Foulke Middleton is said to have failed with his great-grand-daughter, by whom Plas Newydd was transferred to the Middletons of Chirk Castle.

9. *Peirce Middleton*, of Llansilan. Died in 1596, apparently without surviving issue.

1. Jane, married Foulke ap David of Llanrhaidr-yn-Cinmerch.

2. Lucy, married Anthony ap Richard of Denbigh.

3. Margaret, married (1) Thomas ap Thomas ap Jevan of Denbigh, (2) Thomas ap Robert of Denbigh, glover.

4. Alice, married (1) William Walter, or Waller of Hwlford, (2) John Dolben of Denbigh.

5. Ellenor, married Hugh ap Ellys of Denbigh, tanner.

6. Grace, died unmarried.

7. Barbara, married (1) Edward Warden of London, (2) Humphrey Hall of London, draper.
