

AN OHIO GOTT FAMILY
ANCESTORS AND DESCENDANTS

The First Gotts in America

I. Charles Gott, b. about 1600 in Weymouth, Dorchester, England, was married to Thankful (Gift) Palmer in 1625 at St. Andrews, the Great, Cambridge, Cambridgeshire, England. On June 28, 1628, they sailed on the ship "Abigail" with John Endicott, later Governor of the Colony of Massachusetts Bay, and landed at Salem, Mass. Two years later he was voted a Freeman. In 1635 he was made a Deacon of the Church; was a member of the Council and held other civic offices. He died on January 15, 1667.

Charles and Gift Gott had three children: Debora, bpt. December 12, 1636, Charles, bpt. April, 1639, and DANIEL, bpt. April 28, 1646. The Connecticut, the New York and the Ohio Gotts are descendants of the younger son, Daniel, while the Cape Ann and the Maine Gotts are, for the most part, descendants of the son, Charles.

II. Daniel Gott, b. 1646, lived at Wenham. m. Elizabeth Morris January 2, 1665 and had four children: Mary, b. November 27, 1666, Daniel, b. August 15, 1668, JOHN, b. September 17, 1672, and Thomas, b. July 22, 1675; d. August 3, 1675. The Connecticut, New York and Ohio Gotts are descendants of John.

III. John Gott, b. September 17, 1672, m. Elizabeth Tarbox of Lynn. They had a daughter Elizabeth, who married Jas. Skillion of Marblehead, and a son, JOHN, b. April 17, 1700 at Malden, Mass. They moved to Hebron, Conn., about 1704.

IV. John Gott, b. April 17, 1700, m. Eleanor Tarbox. They had five children: Daniel, b. September 5, 1735, Issac, Story, b. March 26, 1733, Esther, b. 1743, who married Zebulon Strong of Colchester on March 25, 1762, and JOHN, b. March 26, 1730. All of the boys were in the French and Indian War from Hebron, Conn. The Pompey and Syracuse Gotts are descendants of Daniel.

V. John Gott, b. March 26, 1730, Hebron, Conn. Children: Lucretia, b. May 17, 1757; John, March 3, 17, 1762, Adolphus, b. February 8, 1760, Story, b. November 1765, David, b. April 11, 1767, d. September 23, 1861. About 1760 the family moved to Austerlitz, Columbia Co. N.Y. Some of the family are buried at Macedonia N.Y. The father and his sons John and Story served in the Revolutionary War and all three drew land grants for their services. Adolphus and David moved in 1789 to East Worcester, Otsego Co. N.Y. David moved to LaGrange Ohio in 1826. Adolphus with his son Peter followed in 1832.

VI. Adolphus Gott, b. February 8, 1766, m. (1) Dilla Hill. Children: William, Talcut, PETER, b. November 28, 1795, d. October 10, 1886, Polly, Betsey. m. (2) Susan Powers. Children: Sally, Joseph, Westelles. m. (3) Betsey Lewis.

VII. Peter Gott, m. Polly Pangburn. Children: Mary Jane, WILLIAM H., b. December 19, 1825, d. June 16, 1917, Walter, Covington, Sidney, Edward, Ellen, Oscar, Caroline, Esther and Delila.

VIII. William H., m. Lorinda Gott (See page 2).

IX. Charles Wm. m. Laura Waite Lincoln (See page 3, 4).
