A 1916 novelty in pinks, ranking high as a pot plant, and flowering out of doors after October.



Mrs. J. Gibson, as a chrysanthemum, is a 1916 phenomenon. She is enormous in stem, foliage and flower, and light pink in color.

Nippon, a new variety of Pompon which blooms early in November. Flesh white in color, with light yellow center. It's a hardy out-door.
