

Captain Alfred J. Hook, Distinguished Service Cross, 106th Infantry, Brooklyn. Killed in action.




Captain Walter S. Keller, of New York. Killed at St. Mihiel on September 16 while leading his company.

Private James Folliart, Jr., Headquarters Detachment, 154th Brigade, New York. Killed in action.




Private Peter Gallan, Co. L, 113th U. S. Infantry, Taftville, Conn. Killed in action.
