

Verdun will always be memorable in French annals because of the immortal phrase: "They shall not pass," that became the watchword of its heroic defenders, and which they made good at such a tremendous sacrifice. Had Verdun been captured, the taking of Paris would have been almost inevitable. Besides indicating the famous Le Mort Homme, Hill 304, the Wood of the Crows and other famous spots, the map shows the lines when the German attack began, where it ended and where the armies rested after the Germans had been driven back in 1917.
